PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – April 23rd 2020

Greetings

We are now into the seventh day of our remote teaching and learning program. The technical glitches that befell us in the first two days seem to have been largely overcome at the school level and the home level, though I feel sure there will be further challenges.

We have received a great deal of feedback from parents – thankyou. I have also asked for and received feedback from our teachers and aides. It is essential to have an idea of how remote learning is travelling from the various perspectives of the teachers, aides, students and parents.

Based on feedback, we have already made some changes to the way the programs are delivered (increased WebEx time for one) and plan to introduce some more changes that we believe will enable improvements in teaching and learning. One problem we discovered from parents was the difficulty some people had with locating the learning packs on Compass. We have decide to name the learning pack files in a common manner, for example:

Year 6 - Week 3 - Literacy

Junior - Week 3 - Physical Education

We are hoping that changes such as these will improve the process.

I had the opportunity today to drop in on a number of class WebEx sessions. It was indeed lovely to see the children - I am missing them greatly as I know all of our staff members are as well. However, it was lovely to see engaged students joining in and asking questions to clarify the day's work. I will continue to drop in!

Please take the time to be with your children, don't place too much pressure on them, we will get through this and your children's education will be fine. Enjoy the important moments in life. We, at present, seem to be containing Covid-19. Spare a thought for those in other countries where the disease has spread rapidly to the point where health systems are unable to cope and thousands upon thousands are dying.

We have taken this opportunity to also have the wall in the meeting room inside the staff room that we currently call the Long Room moved out by 1 metre to make the room much more usable.


