PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – October 15th

Happy Birthday (to us)

Next Monday, Birralee Primary School officially turns 50 years old!

The school opened on the 19th of October 1970. Keen observers will note the original housing stock surrounding the school is circa 1960s and 70s. The original houses and our school were built on land that was formerly covered in apple and pear orchards. The new housing brought with it young families and the need for a new school.

Birralee's enrolment was around 300 in the 1970s, but as the children from the 60s and 70s moved on to high school, the school population slowly reduced over the next two decades. For much of the 1990s and 2000s the school population remained between 150 and 200 and indeed the school was in danger of closing in the 1990s when many Victorian schools were closed and sold off. From 2014 our enrolments steadily (and quickly) grew – we have 583 students this year!

We had many plans to celebrate our 50th year – but Covid-19 stopped those plans in their tracks!

I'm sure we will make sure some of our postponed events can be re-instated once it is safe to do so – we'll just have to celebrate in our 51st year!

Prep Orientation program

Because of the restrictions surrounding Covid-19, our usual prep orientation program will not be able operate as in past years. However our prep team is in the process of devising an innovative way in which we can ensure parents and our new 2021 preps are very well prepared for their time at Birralee - stay tuned for more information in the very near future.

Covid-Safe Restrictions

DET is trying to limit the number of people who come into schools in order to restrict the spread of the virus. The site is restricted to staff members and contractors needed to carry out maintenance and safety works. We are not permitted to have music teachers, sports coaches, dance classes, coding or chess clubs at present.

We only have to look at what has happened with the outbreak in regional areas caused by just one person who entered a café and had a meal. This virus is highly contagious and we must all be vigilant – it spreads so quickly.

Please understand that if you need to bring something to school, you should ring the office from the gate and we will send someone down to you – don't come to the office.





At drop-off and pick-up times, please ensure you maintain a distance of 1.5 metres, wear a mask properly, sanitise your hands before coming to school and leave as soon as you have dropped off or picked up your child. Don't stop to talk with other parents.

One day we will be through this and we can then all resume our previous ways – we just have to be patient, but above all we need to remain safe.

Fun Day

Fun day is looked forward to every year - it is just as it sounds - a day full of fun!

Fun Day will still take place later this term. We have been meeting to decide which of our usual activities can take place under restrictions this year and which other new activities can be included.

Once we are certain of the format we will let everyone know what we will be doing.

Classes for Next Year

Parents who have specific concerns about their child's <u>unique learning needs</u> (not friendship groupings) for 2020 may provide <u>written</u> information to me (not the class teacher) by Friday 26th October. Please note that we are not able to consider information received after this date as once class lists are formulated it is very difficult to make changes.

Safety Issue - too early to school

I know that I frequently talk about the need for children to be punctual – and it is very important. However a number of students are arriving unaccompanied by an adult at school too early – 8:00am to 8:30am when there are no teachers on duty. At this time teachers are in their classrooms preparing for the day – not on duty. Students should not arrive at school unaccompanied by an adult prior to 8:30am. For children who need to be dropped off early, Before School Care is available from 7:00am until school begins. Bookings can be made via the Camp Australia website.

Interrelate Term 4 2020, Grade 4 and 5 students

To Parents / Guardians of Grade 4 students,

Interrelate, in conjunction with your school, is running a course for students in Grade 4.

"Me and the big wide world" is a program designed to explore and create awareness of families through discussing what it means to be in a family and develop knowledge of family differences. Students gain awareness of a range of different values within the community as well as further information on human anatomy, body parts and foetal development. The program assists students to advance their understanding of strategies to be safe and protective behaviours.
