

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - February 5th

Welcome Welcome Back to School for 2021





Due to Covid-19 restrictions last year, we were unable to run our normal prep orientation program, so the first four days of school this year were used instead as an orientation program – and it worked very well! Yesterday all our preps started with their new classmates and teacher. I spent some time with the preps yesterday morning and they had settled in beautifully. Thank you to our prep team, led by Sophia Goh – the team has done a fabulous job in welcoming our new students!

I extend a very special welcome to all our new prep students and others new students throughout the school, and also to their families. This morning our PFA has organised a special welcome morning tea for our new prep families – thank you to Grace Roy our PFA President. The atmosphere at the morning tea was wonderful and welcoming.

As all of our new families will soon find out Birralee is a very community-minded school and I am sure that they too, will feel very much part of our close community in the near future.

Our student enrolment stands at 612 this year—we have two new classes: one in Year 5 and one in Year 6, to cater for the growth we have once again experienced, bringing our total number of classrooms to 27.

Covid-19

Please understand Covid-19 restrictions are still in place. Our students continue to practise good hand hygiene and our cleaning schedule still remains at a higher level than normal.

Masks must be worn by adults when visiting the office. All staff members as a result of the tennis hotel quarantine infection are now following stricter rules as of Wednesday morning, all are now wearing masks when inside. Please continue to assist the community by following all Covid-19 safety procedures. We still need to be vigilant.

Team Kids

Last year the contract for out of school hours came up for renewal. Three companies made presentations to school council. At the end of the process there was a program that stood head and shoulders above the other — Team Kids. Our decision to award the contract to Team Kids has proven to be the right one. The set up and displays are very pleasing and inviting. Ryan, the Director of Service, has a warm and engaging personality, and there are many special offerings for students attending the before School and After School programs such as: art classes, sports clubs, STEM clubs, makerspace, cooking classes, construction and even an optional 'Homework Club'.

Even if you don't plan on sending your child to Team Kids, please go onto the site and register. This means that should you be unexpectedly held up at work or for some other reason can't make it to school on time, you can let us know at school and we will ensure your child goes to Team Kids until you arrive. The atmosphere at the program is fabulous and so I know the children will have a great time. Please go onto the Team Kids website to see the program – you may just find your child would like to attend on a STEM night or cooking night etc.

Team Kids will also run a curriculum day care program when we have pupil free days.

Communications

All of our communications are electronic via Compass. If you know of parents who have not yet downloaded the Compass App, please show them how to do so, to ensure they receive up to date communication from the school. If you have problems logging in, please call the school office for assistance. It is vital that notifications and communications from school are read by all parents.

Parent- Teacher Exchange

This will take place during the afternoon of Wednesday 24th February from 12:00pm. Parents will be able to choose a timeslot themselves via the Compass app. This function will not be available until next week. A notification will go home shortly via Compass informing parents as to how the process will work. At these interviews the teachers will of course, let you know how your child is settling etc. but the primary function of this exchange is for parents to inform the teacher about their child. We believe this early meeting is a valuable source of information which assists the teacher in the classroom.

These interviews will (at this stage) be on site, but there will be other options available.

Curriculum Day/ Parent-Teacher Exchange

Our first Pupil Free Curriculum Day will take place on Wednesday the 24th February. In the morning all staff will take part in professional development. The afternoon will be used to run our parent teacher interviews.

I have spoken with Ryan, our Team Kids Director of Service, and Team Kids will provide Curriculum Day Care for students whose parents are working and are unable to make other arrangements. Bookings can be made via the Team Kids website: https://teamkids.com.au/

Extracurricular Activities during School Hours

At Birralee we place great store on providing a high quality, focussed education for our students - Literacy and Numeracy, of course, are central to academic performance. Time on task, and consistency of practice, are vital to ensure students achieve their best outcomes. Studies have repeatedly shown that the amount of time spent learning a particular subject, plus the veracity and fidelity in the way programs are delivered, are paramount in achieving good outcomes.

From time to time we are asked by parents to give permission for their child to leave school to take part in an activity during school hours. Whilst a one off activity is usually fine, we do have concerns about regular removal from school.

If a child is removed on a weekly basis during a morning session this means in reality that the child may miss 20% of their literacy or maths lessons – and the research is clear – this percentage of missing school does have a negative impact. If in the afternoon he or she will also regularly miss a particular subject. This is very likely to have a negative impact on progress in those subjects too. Parents who choose to enrol their children in programs requiring removal during school hours must understand this is not an ideal situation for academic progress and the decision to do so, may have an undesirable impact. The school is not able to supply make-up lessons.

Whilst this is a decision parents will have to make for their child, our advice is to recommend against regular weekly removal during school hours.

We advise parents to schedule any extracurricular activities no earlier than 4:00pm so that students are able to complete their regular school day.

This will ensure that we have a uniformity of teaching practice and knowledge across the school for our Spalding-based literacy program which has been central to the outstanding results attained here at Birralee. The new teachers will be mentored throughout the year by experienced practitioners of Spalding. We are fortunate to have developed a strong culture of learning among and between staff members at Birralee. The central focus is to improve teaching practice, thus ensuring student learning outcomes are maximised.

Building Works

Our new 5Mod General Purpose Classroom (GPC) which will house year 6 students was installed during January and was handed over to the school just prior to the start of the year. There are a few minor details still to be finished off such as landscaping, however the job is essentially complete. This classroom abuts the staff car park along the southern boundary.

There will be further concreting works during the next holiday period to link the year 5 & Year 6 classrooms, as well as installing a path from the asphalt driveway above the playground, to the Year 5 classrooms. Both of these projects will improve access and safety during wet weather.

Uniform

Please ensure that your children are wearing our correct school uniform. Our sports tops are required for Physical Education and sports practice. Your child will be doing P.E. or sport on specific days — if you are unsure which day that is please check with your child's teacher. Please note that footwear allowed under the school dress code for everyday wear is: black school shoes or black runners (no other colours permitted) for everyday use. If your child needs to wear specific sports shoes for physical education or sport, please pack those shoes into their bag for your child to change into and out of, for those sessions. Please note that all students should have Birralee school bags.

Please Note: It is vital that all items are labelled with the child's name.

School Start Time

We start school at 8:50am each morning. Thank you to the vast majority of students who are punctual. It very important for us to establish a routine in the 10 minutes prior to 9:00am, so that all classroom preparation of desks, books, handing in of notices etc. is completed before 9:00am. When the bell rings the expectation is that the roll is taken and then instruction begins. Latecomers miss out on that instruction and disrupt the learning of others.

There are however students who are too early to school. We would like students to arrive from 8:30am onwards, no earlier as there is no supervision in the yard until 8:30am. Students who need arrive earlier must attend Before School Care.

1:00pm to 1:50pm Lunch Play

1:50pm to 3:30pm 2x 50minute teaching sessions

School Leadership Roles

Our 2021 Year 6 leadership role presentations, including SRC representatives, School Captains, House Captains, Music Leaders, Visual Arts Leaders, Environmental Leaders, Language Leaders, Library Leaders, STEM Leaders and Sports Captains will take place at our Friday afternoon assembly next week.

Parking

Please note that the indented parking bay area in front of the school is for drop off only. Drivers are not permitted to park for longer than two minutes in this area nor are they permitted to be more than 2 metres from their vehicle.

Parents have been fined by ticket inspectors previously and I have been informed by Manningham Council that traffic inspectors will be targeting schools.

If you want to bring your child into the school grounds, please park in the other streets around the school where the parking restriction does not apply. Please also remember that we need to remain on good terms with our neighbours, make sure that driveways remain clear.

Our Active travel program encourages parents to drop off their children and for children to walk along designated routes that are marked by decals along the pavement. Children who walk to school really enjoy the fresh air, exercise and social activity when meeting up with friends along the way – and our traffic at the front of school is reduced as a bonus! Please check our <u>website</u> for details of the routes available.

Newsletter

Our newsletter is put online each Thursday or Friday. Please make sure you pass the word to other parents to download the Birralee Compass App to receive communications from school.

Class and Area Newsletters

These newsletters are a vital means of communication for events and activities at your child's area. These will be posted online. Newsletters from grades are generally once per term but there may be extra communications for certain special events. Make sure you download the Compass App. (yes, this is the third time I have asked for the Compass App to be downloaded!)

School Council Elections

Each year elections are held usually in February or early March for roughly half the school council positions. A notice for elections will be sent home next week. Please take the time to read the information regarding school council – it is a wonderful opportunity to be involved in your child's school.

Hats

Children are required to wear hats when outside when the UV rating is predicted to go above 3. It is strongly recommended that students bring their own supply of sunscreen and also wear sunglasses when outside at recess and lunchtimes. Students who do not have hats will be restricted to the area by the art room on the steps under the covered deck.

Uniform and Dress Code Policy

Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. If you would like to apply please contact the school office and ask for an application form.

Parental Consent

You may notice that you have events awaiting consent on Compass. We use this facility to obtain consent for your child to attend excursions and other activities. We will also be using this facility for other issues that require consent such as local excursions and photo consent. You will be notified when an event requires action by you. To give consent either click on the yellow box on your Compass dashboard or follow the link in the notification. If you have any questions please contact the office or your friendly class rep.

School Nurse

Cathy Pataki is a visiting primary school nurse from the Department of Education and Training. She will be attending the school in March 2021 to conduct the Prep grade health assessments, and to see other children as requested by parents or teachers (with parents' consent).

The purpose of the visit is to provide all children in their first year of primary school with the opportunity to have a health assessment; to link children, families and school communities to services available in the community; and to provide information and advice that promotes health and wellbeing.

Parents of students (other than Prep students) who wish their child to be seen by the school nurse need to complete a Referral Form that is available at the school office. This completed Referral Form needs to be returned to the school office by 12th February 2021.

Swim Carnival

Students were given the opportunity to complete swim races to accrue points for their house and perhaps earn a place to represent the school at the upcoming District Swimming event. 


