PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – May 20th

Wonderful News - State Budget Funding Boost for Birralee

What fabulous news we received today! Sonja Terpstra, Member of the Legislative Council for Eastern

Metropolitan, visited Birralee to announce that we have been given <u>\$4.1 million</u> funding in tonight's state government budget.

Having grown rapidly in enrolments from 160 to 610 over the past 6 years, we have made many representations to regional facilities officers, the Victorian School Building Authority to politicians and indeed the Minister for Education himself since 2017, to highlight the needs of a rapidly growing school.

Thank you so much to Lisa Lavery our school council president who has coordinated the writing of letters to local politicians. Thank you also to the many, many parents who took the time to write those letters and send them to local politicians. It seems our 'squeaky wheel' has been heard at long last!

I will keep the school community fully informed as more of the detail surrounding how the funding can be used, is communicated to the school.

School Tours

On Tuesday we hosted 3 tours throughout the day for parents seeking a school for their children next year. We were extremely proud to talk about our programs and teaching philosophy and then take the parents on a tour through the school where they were able to see our facilities and programs in action in the classrooms. Our students, as usual, were polite, happy, well-mannered and welcoming, and the parents were very impressed with the activities taking place throughout the school. Thank you to our teachers and students for coping so well with the many visitors they had yesterday. We have a fabulous school and it is very easy to sing its praises when visitors attend.

Traffic and Behaviour on Our Streets

I have spoken numerous times in this newsletter, over many years, about keeping our students safe when driving, walking or riding to school.

Traffic and parking rules are in place to ensure the safety of everyone. It is therefore incumbent on all adults, to know and apply the rules as drivers and/or pedestrians. As adults we must set a good example when driving, when using crossings, or crossing roads where there are no supervised crossings. Children watch and mimic the examples shown by the adults in their lives. If adults don't use a crossing, or if an adult tells a child to run across the road to them, then we shouldn't be surprised if that is what children do when adults are not present.

We have had several incidents over the past few weeks which are of great concern:

- Students from our school have run out across the road without looking. Thank you to the car drivers who have been vigilant and who have been driving slowly enough to be able to stop in time.
- A very young student who was supposedly under the supervision of his father when walking to school
 crossed the road ahead of his father without looking the father had no idea as he was on his phone at the
 time. Please keep your phones in your pocket when supervising children they need our undivided attention
 around traffic.
- Students being dropped off against road rules, at street corners
- Parents calling out to children to walk down to their cars waiting in the queue near Balfour Street when they are in the no standing zone. Please don't do this show some patience and wait for a few minutes until you arrive at the pick-up zone. We expect our students to line up at the new gate next to the main gate. When their car drives into the pick-up zone we will let the children go to their cars. This practice is to ensure the safety of students and to have an orderly pick-up.
- Parents and grandparents crossing Heyington Avenue and Wilsons Road with their children in tow, without using the crossing this sets a very poor example and is dangerous. Please use the supervised crossings so that the children will learn to do the same.
- Drivers driving on the wrong side of the road instead of waiting patiently for the traffic to move.
- A road rage incident this week where one parent became aggressively physical with another parent. This is completely unacceptable behaviour. The matter has been reported to police.

Children as we all know, can be unpredictable. How many of us have told our children that they should not chase a ball across the road? However children still do - despite our warnings. As adults we must expect that around our school with over 600 children arriving and leaving, it is likely, given the unpredictable nature of children, that they will at some time engage in some dangerous practices. We, the adults need to be ever vigilant to keep our students safe.

What can we do about this to keep our students safe?

- Practise patience and courtesy on the roads.
- Don't rush drive slowly and very carefully on the surrounding streets expect that children may dart out from between cars.
- Pay attention and adhere to all road rules and parking restrictions they are there for a reason.
- Keep reinforcing safe pedestrian practices with your children. Teach them to stop and look both ways, teach them to use the crossings.
- Set a good example for all students at Birralee.

Please remember that there is a 2 minute limit for cars parked in the drop off zone between 3pm and 4pm. Please move off promptly as soon as your child has their seat belt on and it is safe to do so.

Cyber Safety

I have lost count of how many times I have spoken about the need for very strict parental supervision of digital devices. Three days ago I read the following article in 'The Age' newspaper. It was chilling. <u>I urge all parents to read</u> the article and take action at home. Please make sure your children have strict supervision.


Book Fair 2021
