#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - May 13th



#### **Education Week**

Next Tuesday we will be holding our 2023 Open Day. There will be three tours throughout the day for parents investigating schools for their children in 2023. If you know of anyone in our area, or who is moving to our area, and who is searching for a school, please ask them to ring the office and Deb or Pam will book them into a tour.

The feedback I have been receiving from parents who have recently visited Birralee has been very positive indeed. Our academic progress is extremely good, and parents have been taken with the breadth of programs we offer across academia, the arts and sports. Our facilities and our beautiful grounds have also impressed visitors.

Probably the selling points for our school however are our students and teachers and other staff members. The children are always actively involved in their learning throughout the day and are also very welcoming and friendly. The classrooms are exciting places to visit with so much going on. Only today, Assistant Principal, Jacque Clement, and I took a student who will begin with us next week on a tour of the school with his father. It was delightful to see how welcoming our students were to the new child – it was commented upon by the father. Thank you, students, and staff members, you make me feel proud.

#### **Testing Time**

During the next three weeks teachers will be very involved in academic assessments of students from Foundation to Year 6. We have strict assessment schedules set out for students in literacy and numeracy. We always seek to have multiple assessments for different areas in order to triangulate the data and gain an accurate understanding of each child's abilities and where they sit on the educational continuum. These data along with teacher observations are used to assist in the reporting process for half-year written student reports.

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students are also currently taking part in the NAPLAN assessments in Reading, Writing, Grammar and Punctuation, Spelling and Numeracy.

In view of all the academic testing taking place, please ensure that your children attend school over the forthcoming assessment period so that teachers can finalise assessments.

#### **Enrolments**

As most parents should be well aware by now, we are now taking enrolments for Foundation 2023. All state schools now have very strict enrolment procedures directing us to take students from within our zone. We will aim for no more than 80 Foundation students in 2023, giving us four classes of 20 students. However, what makes this difficult to plan for, is that after having accepted 80 enrolments at the end of Term 3, families continue to move into the area in December, during the summer vacation period or during the following year. If the family is inside our designated neighbourhood zone, we will accept the enrolment – because of this factor we may go over the enrolment target of 80.

Our enrolment restriction is administered, in accordance with DET regulations, on the following basis:

Students from within zone

Out of zone siblings (I will not turn away out of zone siblings)

New out of zone students

Compassionate grounds (requiring Regional approval)

A number of parents have already enrolled younger siblings - thank you to those parents who did so. If there are any more siblings yet to be enrolled, please do so as soon as possible so that we can begin to plan for next year.

#### Forthcoming Flu Season Practices and Protocols—A message from DET

With borders opening and the arrival of colder weather, cases of influenza (the flu) are increasing throughout Victoria. Our community is at risk of higher rates of students and staff affected by the flu or COVID-19 this season.

#### What to do if your child gets sick

To help keep your child and our school community safe, please take the following steps if your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms:

take a COVID-19 test and follow the current <u>Department of Health isolation requirements</u> if a positive result is shown

- keep your child at home until their symptoms pass
- common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired
- diagnosis of the flu can only be confirmed by a doctor after a nose or throat swab
- encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and ask them to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

#### **COVID-19 vaccination**

COVID-19 vaccines are available free of charge to everyone aged 5 years and over in Australia.

It is important that children and young people have the best possible protection against the flu and COVID-19 by getting vaccinated.

Ensuring your children are protected against serious illness helps to protect everyone in our community, including older family members who may be at higher risk, along with younger children who can't receive vaccinations yet.

You can book COVID-19 vaccinations through the COVID-19 hotline on 1800 675 398 or at a participating GP, pharmacy, or community health service.

Some local schools are also holding walk-in COVID-19 vaccination clinics on school grounds. Vaccination settings can be found at the <u>Vaccine Clinic Finder</u>.

#### Flu vaccination

Flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and over.

Some people are more at risk of complications from the flu and are eligible for free vaccination under the <u>National Immunisation Program</u> including:

- anyone aged 65 years and older
- pregnant women (at any stage of <u>pregnancy</u>)
- all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged from 6 months and over
- people 6 months or older with:
  - heart disease
  - <u>chronic lung disease</u> (including people with severe <u>asthma</u> who require frequent hospital visits)
  - chronic neurological conditions
  - haemoglobinopathies (blood disorders caused by genetic changes)
  - impaired immunity
  - diabetes
  - kidney disease
- children on long-term aspirin therapy from 6 months to 10 years
- children aged from 6 months to under 5 years.

Flu vaccinations can be booked through GPs and pharmacies, many of which can also provide COVID-19 vaccinations. If you would like more information about the flu vaccination, visit the <u>Better Health Channel</u>.






